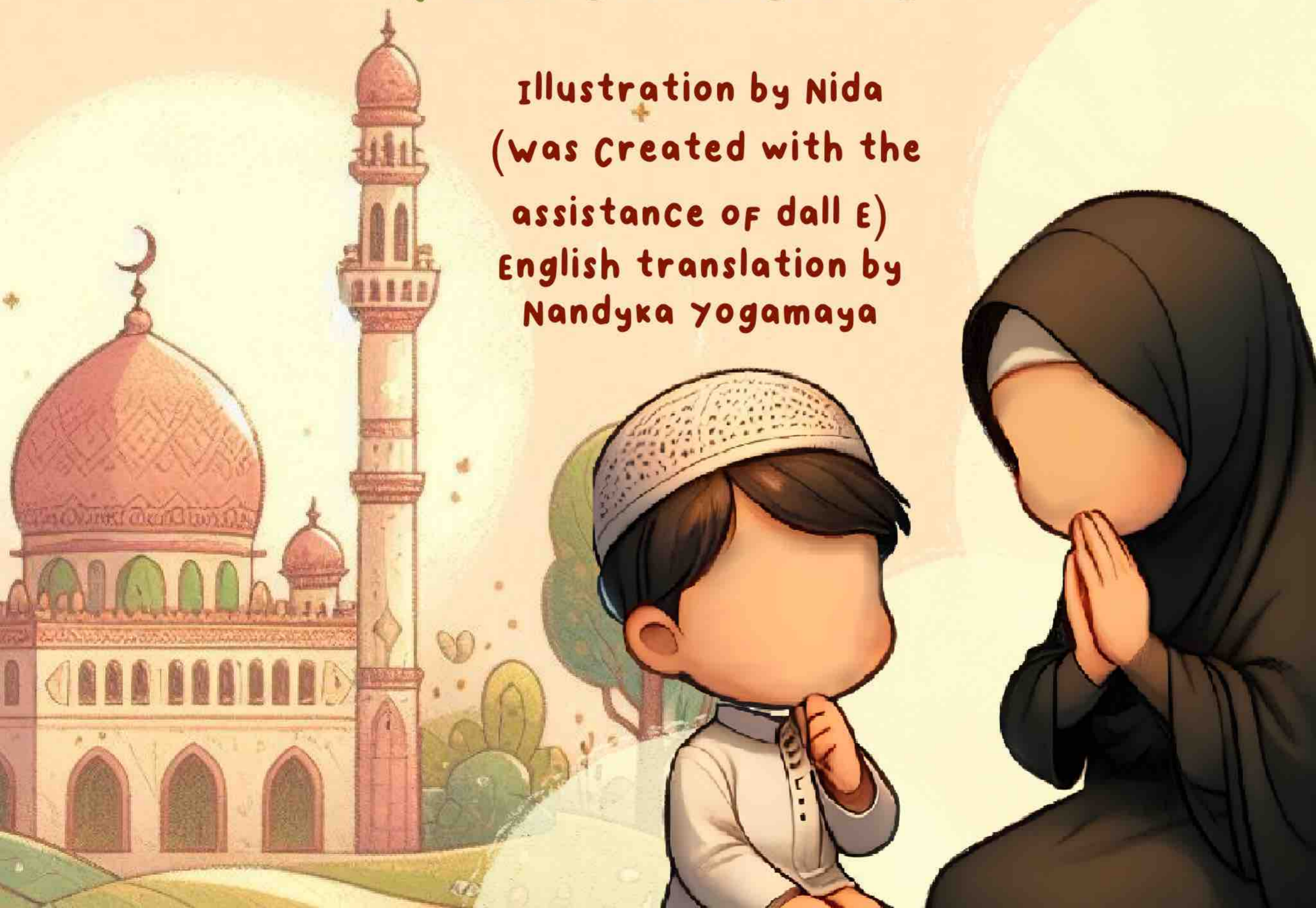


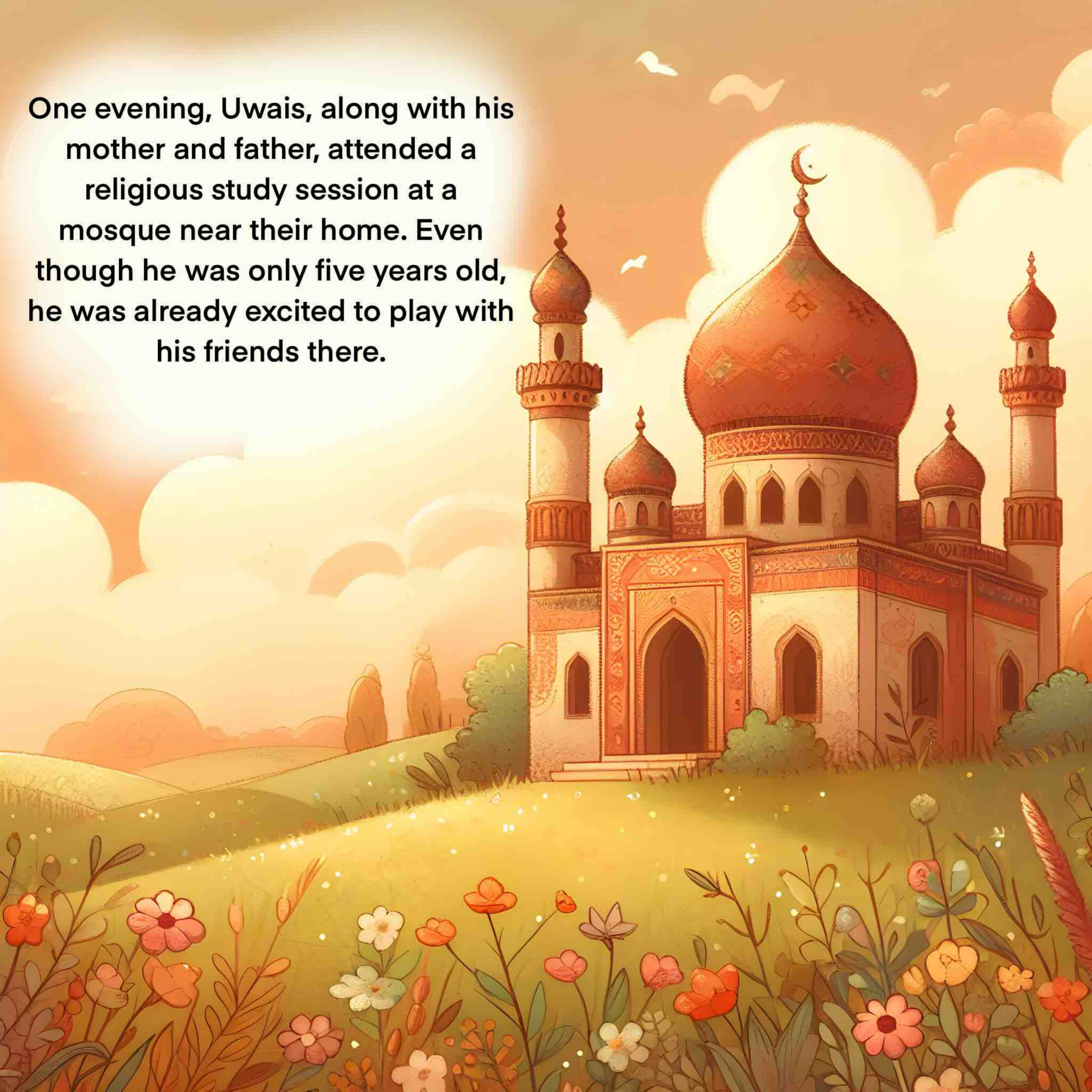
Asmaul Husna

mom asked.

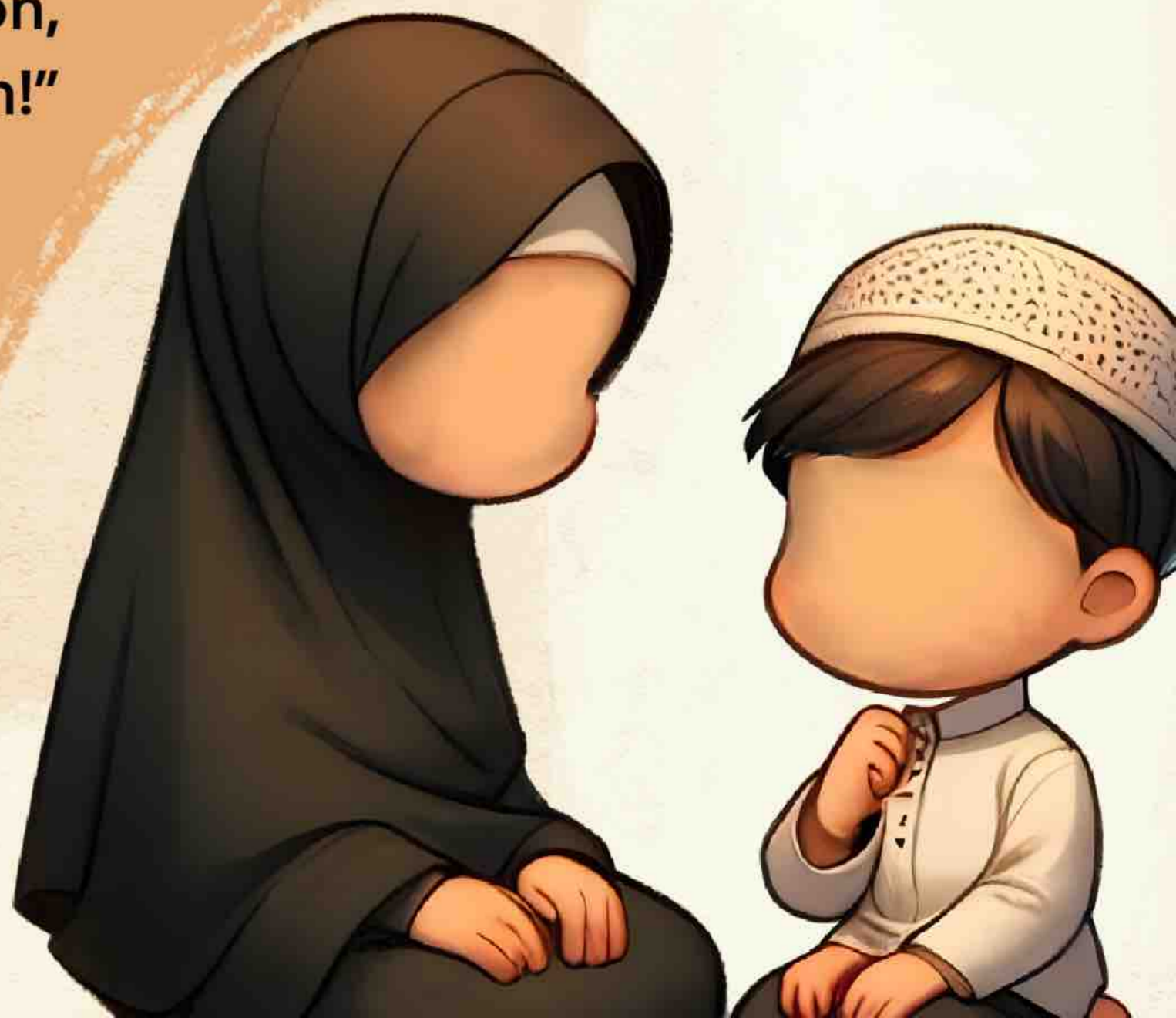
