Pray Salah!

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**Are you able to perform salah already?
If not, let's learn how to do it together!
And If you already know how, let's
continue performing salah.**

Salah is the pillar of our religion. If we neglect salah, we lose our identity as Muslims. Salah is the first thing that will be questioned on the Day of Judgment. We must not neglect salah for any reason. If we are unable to stand, we are allowed to pray sitting or lying down.

We must dress modestly during salah. For men, the area to cover is from the navel to the knees. Men should also cover their shoulders during salah. As for women, their entire body should be covered, except for the face and palms.



Our clothes and the place for salah should also be free from impurities. Impurities are considered unclean by Islamic law. What are some examples of impurities? Examples include human urine and feces, menstrual blood, dog saliva, and the carcasses of animals, except for fish and locusts.





In addition to being clean from impurities, we are also not allowed to perform salah while in a state of hadath. Hadath is divided into two types: minor hadath, such as passing gas, and major hadats, such as a woman experiencing menstruation or postnatal bleeding. Minor hadath is removed by performing ablution, while major hadath is removed by taking a bath. Ablution or bathing can be replaced by a tayammum when there is no water available or when one is unable to use water.

During salah, we must be serious and focused. We are not allowed to joke around, talk, laugh, eat, or drink. We should also wear appropriate clothing. Our recitations and movements during salah should follow what was taught by the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him).
