When entering the mosque, we should step in with our right foot while saying a prayer, "O Allah, open the doors of Your mercy for me."



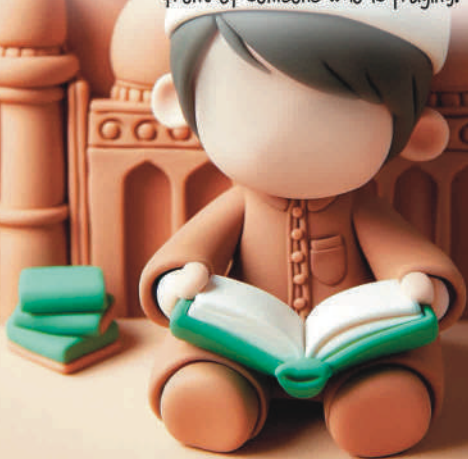
